From the Community Lay Director

It's now the end of December, and Christmas has come and gone once again. The New Year is upon us, football is finally coming to a close (with the exception of the Super Bowl), soon we'll be talking about major league baseball's spring training and if the NBA will ever shorten its season to something other than 12 months. I'm not obsessing on sports, but we seem to have a lot to choose from right at this minute.

My problem, if I dare share this, is that I want a "do-over." I want to go back and "do-over" Christmas and Advent again. It seemed to me that the season was here and gone before we knew it. It just happened so fast that I want to do it again, just to see if I missed something!

But what, in reality, would I do if indeed a "do-over" were possible? Would I change anything at all? They say that hindsight is 20-20, so it's possible I can reflect upon things that have happened and wish I could change them. Only reality tells me I cannot. What is done is done. All I can do is try and do better the next time.

I can gain some assurance of this from the fact that God's word tells us that "...Because of the LORD'S great love we are not consumed, for his compassions never fail. They are new every morning; great is your faithfulness." (Lamentations 3:22-23 TNIV) What I draw from this is that we can start fresh each day, not necessarily a "do-over," but with another opportunity to find ways to serve God and our brothers and sisters.

This desire for a "do-over" moment comes partly from the fact of how miserably I failed God during Advent. I believe I shared with some of you the event that took place near where I work, where a presumably homeless, or at the very least, very down-on-his-luck individual was standing at an intersection, downcast and hoping for a handout. The short story is that he didn't get a handout or a hand up from me. I thought about it. I put it into that category of "I'll do it when I see him again" only he wasn't ever there again. And God has given me plenty of opportunity since that day to lament over what I didn't do.

I have had plenty of folks trying to reassure me that all is not lost (I deeply appreciate that!). But it still reminds me that there are times when we fail to project the image and fact that as Christians we are supposed to do more than just think about helping a brother. Those service cards we received on the Walk to Emmaus that are used at share *(Continued on Page 2)*

groups ask the question of how we failed—not to show how pathetic we are, but to call us into accountability and awareness. We need to be reminded that we often fail the Father, Son and Holy Spirit. Perhaps not intentionally, but it happens. But the good news is that although we don't get a "do-over," we get another chance! God understands our weakness and provides us with ample opportunities to show the world who He is, to share the story of Christ our Lord, and to prove the Holy Spirit is alive and working within us.

The new year is upon us, and with it comes more opportunities. I may never get a "do-over" in my lifetime. But I thank God that He believes in second chances!

I like a list of resolutions prepared by the Rev. Walter Schoedel. He calls them '7-UPS for the New Year.' No, this has nothing to do with the soft drink. These 7-UPS fall under the heading of attitudes and actions.

The first is **WAKE UP**--Begin the day with the Lord. It is His day. Rejoice in it.

The second is **DRESS-UP**--Put on a smile. It improves your looks. It says something about your attitude.

The third is **SHUT-UP**--Watch your tongue. Don't gossip. Say nice things. Learn to listen.

The fourth is **STAND-UP**--Take a stand for what you believe. Resist evil. Do good.
