From the Community Lay Director

If I were to paraphrase one of my favorite passages in the Holy bible (Ecclesiastes 3), I could say that there is a “season for every time” as opposed to a “time for every season”. Quite honestly, we are in the midst of summer, although it hasn’t seemed like it up to this point. Abnormally low temperatures to begin July (who would have thought you needed a sweatshirt in July?), higher than average rainfall in the spring (reminds me of Seattle anytime of the year), and what promises to be a hot and humid weekend as I write this column just reminds me that the seasons of time we are so used to often blend together. We seemingly can’t tell when one season ends before another takes over, and, as often is the case when winter finally calls it quits, we sometimes jump seasons, like when summer begins before spring even gets a chance!

I am reminded of all of this because my wife told me that the Hobby Lobby store in Lancaster was getting out their fall goods for sale, as well as some Christmas material. Last weekend, we saw a sign at a small Christmas shop that proudly announced “175 shopping days left”. It was, as I was reminded by looking at the calendar, July. Not October, November or December. *July.*

I like to see one season at a time. I want to celebrate the 4th of July before I have to plan on buying my Thanksgiving turkey. The Christmas season shouldn’t start before Labor Day and end by Halloween...otherwise, what good is that calendar anyway?

Work with God

My personal Bible reading recently brought me into the book of Nehemiah, which finds Jerusalem in an interesting situation. Not many years before, the temple had been rebuilt under the leadership of Ezra. Now Nehemiah has been given permission to return to Jerusalem. The temple looks good, but the city is still a shambles, especially the walls, which lie in ruins, their gates burned away.

In that condition, the city is open to all kinds of outside forces, from wild animals to thieves to invading enemies. Nehemiah faces the daunting job of rebuilding the walls while keeping up defenses and weathering all sorts of criticism.

Little wonder, then, that Nehemiah is feeling overwhelmed. It's hard to stay motivated when your critics are out to kill you.

Nehemiah has an answer, however. It can be summed up in three words: "work with God." Pray and trust in God, but have a plan. Post a guard. Keep your defenses up. Using that strategy, Nehemiah is able to complete the



rebuilding of the walls in an incredible 52 days, thereby restoring the protection and security of the walls to Jerusalem.

Pretty clearly, we can learn from Nehemiah's example. Thankfully, very few of us have critics who are out to kill us, but the world can be a tough place anyway. We too need to be alert so that the world doesn't overwhelm us.

Work with God. Know when to pray and when to act, and how to combine the two into a way of life that is pleasing to God. May God be with you and strengthen you on the way.

The Geography of the Old Testament (part two in a series)


If there are two subjects that tend to put people to sleep, they are history and geography. We mentioned last time that there is a lot of history in

the Bible, and that we need to understand that history in order to understand God's story. Well, we also need to understand the geography of the Bible, the names, locations, and distances between places, in order to understand the history. So, bear with me, because if you do, you will be rewarded with a greater knowledge of God's Word.

I've included a map for reference. Since we have to deal with a lot of bodies of water and locations, I couldn't find a map with everything on it that we need to refer to. But this map has most of them, and we'll be able to locate the others by reference points on the map. Also, my apologies to those of you who are getting hard copies in grayscale. You'll have to compensate a little. For you, the sort of solid gray areas are the bodies of water, and the rest is the land area. With that, here is what you need to be able to locate:

The Mediterranean Sea. The biggest blue area, to the west (left) on the map.

The Sea of Galilee. Really just a small lake, fourteen miles long and seven miles wide, it is not ...*(continued on page 4)*





(continued from page 3).....quite visible on the map, but there is a marker for it about the middle of the east end of the Mediterranean. It's about 36 miles inland.

The Dead Sea. The lowest point on earth, almost 3,000 feet below sea level, it is just barely visible, and clearly marked, south of (below) the Sea of Galilee.

The Jordan River. It is not visible on the map, but flows south out of the Sea of Galilee into the Dead Sea.

The Nile River. You will find the Nile River and the Nile Delta both clearly marked at the bottom of the Mediterranean Sea, just to the left of center on the map.

The Persian Gulf. The body of water toward the lower right corner of the map.

The Tigris and Euphrates Rivers. Look for the two rivers that run into the Persian Gulf at its upper left. When you trace them back, you can see which river is which.

The Garden of Eden. No one knows exactly where it was; however, we know that it was located around four rivers, and that the Tigris and Euphrates were two of them. Therefore, the Garden was located somewhere in the general area marked "Mesopotamia" in the right center area of the map.

Canaan (aka Israel and Palestine at various times). A relatively small piece of land at the eastern end of the Mediterranean Sea, and located between it and the Sea of Galilee, Jordan River and Dead Sea.

Jerusalem. The capital of the nation of Israel, located at the top of the Dead Sea.

Egypt. The Nile River flows through the heart of Egypt, so look for Egypt in the area of the Nile.

Assyria. Located in the general area of the Tigris and Euphrates Rivers, and the land of Mesopotamia.

Babylonia. You'll find it just to the west (left) of the Persian Gulf.

Persia. Not identified on the map, but not surprisingly, it is located at the top of the Persian Gulf.

If you're new to all this, don't worry. These names will soon mean more to you, as they play a huge part in the story that will unfold as you dig deeper into your Bible.


