From Our Board Chair

Greetings to you in the name of our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ.

Lent is a time of self-examination. It is a time for us to take a good look at our Christian lives and see where we need to improve or make changes. For instance, is your prayer life as active as it should be? Do you make Bible study a top priority in your life? Are you using the gifts and talents that God gave you to serve Him? Many of us feel we don't have any gifts worth sharing with others. Too often we don't feel worthy or good enough to be a disciple of Jesus. We feel we have nothing to offer Him. But that is not true. God has given all of us gifts to be used in His service. We need to ask Him to show us those gifts and how He wants us to use them for Him.

When we have those feelings of unworthiness we need to remember the story about the miracle of Jesus feeding the five thousand. This story is the only miracle Jesus performed that is recorded in all four Gospels. It shows Jesus meeting the most basic human needs using 5 barley loaves and 2 small fish. The disciples simply took the only thing they could find to eat, gave it to Jesus and He blessed it. From that small gift of food, over 5,000 people were fed and there was food left over!

Jesus wants to bless all our lives that way. We are called to be ourselves, to bring what we have to God and allow Him to bless what we bring for His service. When we see life through Jesus' eyes it's natural to spot opportunities to be a disciple. Too often we miss them because we tend to focus mainly on ourselves and our concerns. We are afraid we'll say the wrong thing or sing the wrong note or make a mistake. Only when we look beyond ourselves and put our focus on Christ, can we then be the disciples He desires us to be. Remember, Christ is counting on you.


