From the Community Lay Director

"A Million Points of Light"

Many people enjoy going out on a warm summer evening and looking up into the sky and observing the moon, stars and such. I actually prefer what little star-gazing that I do to be in the winter time. At that time of the year, with the cold, clean and crisp air, there doesn't seem to be anything that blocks the view. The summer humidity and the bugs tend to bother me, so I prefer the clarity of winter.

Gazing up at the heavenly bodies makes me wonder a lot about what heaven will be like. I can read the Biblical & theological descriptions...but don't you just wonder? Are there really streets of gold or is that an abstract thought that can't be clearly explained? The reality is that it won't really matter when we come into the presence of Christ and God. We will stand in awe of the presence of the Most Holy and our thoughts about what something will be like will pale in comparison to actually experiencing it.

I remember a former president talking about "a million points of light". I think I remember that being a reference to people doing good things for each other, and forgive me if I am wrong, but that's the way I remember it. What I also remember is comparing that to looking at the stars...which literally are billions of points of light...and seeing God's handiwork.

There's another place where we can see what seems to be "a million points of light". I saw it during Candlelight on Men's Walk #17 (my Walk to Emmaus). I remember walking into a room filled with a million candle-holding people (well, it seemed like it, didn't it?). I remember my wonderment at the awe of the moment.

Since that time, I have had the wonderful experience of participating in Candlelight a countless number of times, as a Community Member and as a part of a live-in team. And every time I go I see a million points of light...a billion stars...a glimpse of heaven.

I can remember the countless number of people who have stood and described the experience as wondering if that moment in time wasn't at least a glimpse of heaven and hoping that it was! However, it isn't the candle that shines at Candlelight. It's the love that radiates from each person for those who are taking that Walk to Emmaus. It's the love we have for our neighbor and our God. It's the 'agape' we bring to the event—that unconditional love for another person.

Quite honestly, most of the time very few of us know anything about the Pilgrims other than the one we might sponsor, but it doesn't stop us from loving them. The one song that is sung during the Weekend is "They Will Know We Are Christians By Our Love" and it's true. And we sing the "Love Chorus" during that Candlelight time because we mean it, not because we have to.

We hold those candles as one of those million points of light...a single star of heaven...because someone did it for us. We raise them high...just as Jesus raised His arms high and wide for us. We see the reflection of the light in someone else's face, and the glow that is beginning from within as the love pours out, not only from the Candlelight event, but from heaven above, and we see what heaven will be like.
