From the Community Lay Director

"In Remembrance"

As we go through this year together, I want to take a look at the various parts of our Walk to Emmaus. You might have already figured out part of this. I don't think it hurts us at all to revisit the Walk and to look at it in different ways, possibly opening our hearts, minds and souls to all that God has to offer us through Jesus Christ on the Walk to Emmaus.

This month, I would like to look at a little bit of what happens on Thursday night. Most of us remember that sometime on that evening we saw a video. Can you remember the title? Can you remember what it was about? Do you even remember the video being shown? It was an unexpected event, one of many to be sure. I can sit here today, having seen the film what seems to be a countless number of times, and still wonder about the thing and its purpose for the Walk to Emmaus.

For the record, the film is entitled *"In Remembrance"* and it lasted something like 39 minutes, not the eternity that some of us thought it did. We know that it took place in the Upper Room at Passover, shortly before Jesus' crucifixion. It depicts the events of the last supper, and introduces us to the nature of Holy Communion, by placing us in the room with the disciples on that night. While we know that this is important, why didn't we have a film that dealt with those fellows walking on the road from Jerusalem to Emmaus? After all, this is the Walk to Emmaus, isn't it?

I am guessing that you could contact the International Walk to Emmaus office and get the specifics about why this is, but I have another theory. The first part of it involves the fact that the disciples were all gathered at the table in community that night with Jesus. Sound familiar? Take a look at April's newsletter. We talked a lot about being at the table, in community together. The second part of my theory is wrapped up in the discussions given by Judas and Phillip. It may not be obvious, but I think there was a lot to be learned from listening to both of them describe their experiences with Christ.

Judas starts us off, all alone, sitting by a fire, pondering all that had happened as he betrayed Jesus. Judas had begun this ministry well-intentioned, as they all had. But somewhere along the way, Judas had allowed Satan to take control. Judas had allowed things like power, control, and greed to take over. Judas no longer could see the point of helping others (he thought it was a waste of resources) when helping himself seemed so much better.

Judas had become so selfish that he had wanted a Jesus who would be an earthly king, and if there were an earthly king, then there would be an earthly treasury and treasurer, and more opportunity to serve self than others. In contrast, there is Phillip. Phillip is sitting with Bekka, his girlfriend. He is remembering all of the things that he and the others had been through. Phillip describes missing his family and friends, and certainly Bekka. She wants him to stay—I would think a part of him wanted to stay. But Phillip expresses a well-known feeling—the unexplainable draw of Christ. Phillip knows there is something more, something greater than he involved. Phillip doesn't think about himself but about others and the things they can do. He knows he must return and continue the work, even at the cost of his relationship with Bekka. He sees the self-less acts of Jesus and knows where he needs to be.

Why do we need to watch “*In Remembrance*”? I think that somewhere in our consciousness, we all are between Judas and Phillip—fighting the battle of being selfish and self-less. Our journey on the Road to Emmaus helps us realize that we can indeed go from one to the other. Unlike Judas, however, it's a road that we do not travel alone. We look up and see someone traveling with us, someone who we find ourselves inexplicably drawn to, much like Phillip. Someone who walks with me and talks with me and tells me I am his own, as the song says.

Indeed, this is the Walk to Emmaus, where we can go from being selfish to self-less, one step at a time, as long as we have Jesus walking with us. It's one of the many journeys we make on our walk.
